The Global Sports Challenge has now come to an exciting finish! This year, 45 schools and 21,924 students across our NAE family took part, exercising together and cheering each other on. You logged an amazing 139,227 hours of activity, which equals 417,681 miles, taking us around the world over four times.

Along the way, we discovered legendary athletes from many different countries and learned how their stories inspire people everywhere. We also saw how each of you stayed active in your own way and how your posts encouraged others to keep moving!

Thank you for being part of this global fitness journey. Your energy, teamwork, and enthusiasm helped make this our strongest challenge yet!

<u>Feet First: Juilliard Dance</u> <u>Project</u>

Juilliard Dance students have created videos of movement phrases that show just feet and legs, and your challenge is to create your own dance by making up moves for the rest of your body! You can develop the piece using your arms, head, hands, torso, and more, then revise and refine your movement, and add your own choice of music. After rehearsing and recording your dance, you can upload it to the Performance Sharing Wall to share it with the students on Global Campus.

You can dance on your own, or with others, and Juilliard has provided lots of strategies to help you choreograph your Feet First dance. You'll also be able to reflect with other students who are doing the project, share your ideas and how you developed your dance, and add your thoughts to the Reflection Sharing Wall.

Topical Talks


